How to deal with the unprofitable Customer

Unprofitable customers are becoming a big drag on the bottom-line of many businesses. They consume more resources than they pay for. They divert attention from a company's profitable customers, and they create tension between the sales team and management. The instinct is to get rid of them but there are a host of reasons why they are unprofitable. 
