Small Business Centre Presents Business Speaker Series: Accessibility—Public Rights and Business Duties on Tuesday, January 26 at 7 pm: Gerald Chipeur, QC will address accessibility from a business perspective. Gerry has practiced law in Canada for over 35 years and has appeared in the Supreme Court of Canada on over two dozed appeals, including appeals involving the duty of the employer to make a reasonable accommodation. In his last four court cases, he has argued for:

- Indigenous self-government on behalf of Siksika Nation Court of Appeal of Alberta
- The constitutionality of the Mental Health Act civil confinement provisions on behalf of Alberta Health Services - Court of Appeal of Alberta
- The unconstitutionality of the Manitoba Emergency Public Health Act Order prohibiting drive-in church on behalf of Springs Church - Manitoba Court of Queen's Bench
- The absence of constitutional jurisdiction of Canada over provincial health care records - Federal Court of Canada
