Don F. Neufeld Medallion of Excellence Lowell Cooper



Born in Medicine Hat, Alberta, **Lowell** grew up on a farm in southeastern Alberta and attended public school until high school. Lowell's parents, Charles and Violet, had a keen desire for their children to attend a Seventh-day Adventist school. Just as Lowell was about to enter high school his parents sold the farm and moved to Lacombe, Alberta so that the children could be enrolled in a church school.

Lowell completed high school and enrolled in the Theology program at Canadian Union College. Lowell was one of several young men who earned their entire College tuition by working year-round on the College farm.

After graduating from the BTh program in 1967 Lowell married Rae Lee Figuhr and the couple moved to Berrien Springs, Michigan where Lowell attended seminary at

Andrews University. After completing the Bachelor of Divinity (subsequently changed to Master of Divinity) requirements the couple returned to Alberta where Lowell served as pastor of the Peace River district.

Later, Lowell was assigned by the Alberta Conference to departmental responsibilities at the Conference office in Calgary. During the time in Calgary Lowell participated in the first off-campus Master of Public Health degree program of the Loma Linda University School of Public Health.

In 1977 Lowell and his family were invited by the General Conference to accept an interdivision assignment to Pakistan. After 2 1/2 years there, Lowell was elected as a department director in the Southern Asia Division headquarters at Pune, India.

Lowell and his wife served in the Southern Asia Division for over 16.5 years before Lowell was elected (1994) as an Associate Secretary of the General Conference. In 1998 Lowell was appointed as a General Vice President of the General Conference—a role he held for almost 17 years.

In this role he traveled extensively in all parts of the world consulting and teaching on leadership life within the SDA Church and its institutions. Lowell has served on numerous boards and committees. He also served as vice-chair of the General Conference Auditing Service.

After completing over 46 years of denominational employment Lowell retired at the end of 2016. In his retirement years he remains active in leadership and governance training in various locations around the world. He and Rae Lee are also both heavily engaged in local church responsibilities.

Rae Lee is a nurse (retired) and musician. The Coopers live in Kennewick, Washington, near their children: daughter Jondell, a pediatric nurse; and son Todd, an oral maxillofacial surgeon. They are blessed with a loving daughter-in-law (physician), a devoted son-in-law (respiratory therapist) and three wonderful teenage grandchildren.

Honorary Alumnus of the Year Nicole Paradis-Sydenham



Nicole Paradis-Sydenham retired in February 2020 as the Admissions Officer at Burman University where she worked for over 20 years. She has always had a passion for encouraging potential students to attend Burman University and she never misses an opportunity to recruit. On many occasions, Nicole traveled for Marketing & Enrolment to recruit at General Conferences sessions, at campmeetings, and at pastors' staff meetings as a bilingual ambassador for Burman University. Nicole is known by many students as the person who went above and beyond the call of duty. She also played a big role in retaining students, and with her open-door policy, whenever a student was struggling, she was always willing to listen to their concerns and then nurture them and make suggestions to improve their situations.

In 1995, she graduated valedictorian from Collège Universitaire de St-Boniface with a Bilingual Administrative Assistant certificate.

In 1990, Nicole was the pioneer as the first Canadian Conference Women's Ministries Director to be appointed in Canada and has served for over 20 years in three different conferences: Quebec, Manitoba and 14 of the 23 years in Alberta.

Nicole has had the privilege of being keynote speaker for women's retreats across Canada and USA, at graduations, and at various campmeetings. She has been involved with pastoral ministry for decades: a pastor's wife for the past 40 years, elder at the College Heights Seventh-day Adventist Church in Lacombe for 23 years, and since May 2021, she serves as quarter-time visiting pastor. In addition to speaking engagements, she has contributed several stories for devotional books.

Nicole likes to tell stories and make people laugh and loves to take pictures to remember the moment and share it with those in the photo. But most of all, she enjoys helping others have a personal connection with Jesus. Her passion is to encourage others and share Bible truths that are relevant to what they are going through in their lives.

She enjoys travelling with her husband of fifty years, Pastor Ron, to Kenya and Rwanda on humanitarian projects with A Better World. She loves cooking a meal and getting together with their four children, their spouses and 11 grandkids.

Ryan is also a loving husband of 16 years to Courtnie, who he met online while working as Youth Pastor of the Red Deer SDA Church. He is the doting father to three wonderful daughters Ella, Alyssa, and Eden. Ryan believes very strongly that families should invest in Adventist Education and is a proud graduate of Andrews University with a Masters of Divinity, a Bachelor of Arts in Theology from Burman University, and a graduate of Parkview Adventist Academy. Don Dubyna was born in North Battleford, Saskatchewan and **Charlene (Gibbons) Dubyna** was born in Vernon, British Columbia. They graduated from Canadian Union College in 1969 and 1974, respectively. They both attended college at CUC for one year, with Charlene attending summer school classes between 1984 and 1996 and graduating with a Bachelor of Education degree in 1996.

The Dubynas have made volunteering a way of life. They travelled with the Manitoba/Saskatchewan conference on mission trips to Mexico, Bolivia, and Louisiana, USA. Closer to home, Don and Charlene were involved in service through a Maranatha project at Camp Whitesand in Saskatchewan. They also volunteered their time to support a program through the North Battleford church called Neighbours Connected. Among other projects, the Dubynas helped renovate a house for a single

mother with two boys-an undertaking that took a month to complete.

Upon relocating to Lacombe, their passion for volunteering combined with opportunities to help, meant they continued serving others. Both Don and Charlene have worked at the Lacombe Food Bank as well as the Red Deer soup kitchen and have often taken their grandchildren along with them—nurturing another generation of service. They enjoy helping out in soup kitchens so much that they have done so in a couple of locations while away on vacation!

Helping newcomers to Canada, the Dubynas have tutored English and provided transportation to appointments.

Charlene puts her enjoyment of sewing to use by providing items for campmeetings, sewing baby blankets for Africa and for hospitals, and for care packages prepared for children in need.

For many years, the Dubynas have provided programming in church children departments, including their current roles serving in the Primary Division of the College Heights church. As well, they've volunteered at Burman University to assist with relocating departments. In addition, Don built growboxes for the Burman University greenhouse. As a team, they have also spent time at College Heights Christian School and Mamawi Atosketan Native School helping out with getting them ready for new school years.

Don and Charlene enjoyed helping at the North Battleford Family Fun Day prior to moving to Lacombe— which gave them the heart for serving their local community. Now the Lacombe community benefits, as they assist with the Lacombe and area annual Kids Carnival and Father's Day event.

In October 2023, Charlene and Don travelled to Africa with humanitarian agency "A Better World", where they visited Rwanda and Kenya (and also, as Charlene tells the story, they stepped over the border into Tanzania so technically 'visited' that country as well!)
