



Identifying the “E” in EDI: Equity at Burman University

Equity, Diversity, and Inclusion (EDI) has become a defining framework for institutions around the world—but at Burman University, the “E” in EDI carries a particularly profound meaning. As a Seventh-day Adventist-owned and operated institution, our mission is rooted in the belief that every person is created in the image of God, endowed with dignity, purpose, and immeasurable worth. 
