There is lots of information on Google, but there is a lot of misinformation too. Library databases have quality, peer-reviewed articles that have been checked by experts. Your professors will expect you to use these resources in your academic papers

SEE A FACULTY LIBRARIAN

Librarians are experts in finding and evaluating the best information you may need for your classes. Ms. Clark can help you find scholarly resources far beyond an ordinary Google search. She is willing to make special appointments to ensure that students with difficult schedules can get the help they need.

Librarians can help with the following:

- focus your topic into a research question
- select appropriate sources to search for information
- develop effective search strategies for library databases and the internet
- ensure your research results are on the right track
- answer any other questions you may have regarding finding, retrieving, and using information

USING THE LIBRARY OFF-CAMPUS

To access the library's resources off-campus, visit www.burmanu.ca/library/myaccount. You will be asked to input a barcode and PIN. Your barcode is the 13 digit number on your ID card beginning with '155' and your PIN is the last 4 digits of the shorter number located at the bottom right of your ID card.

PAYING FINES

Students are always encouraged to return their library books before or on the due date to avoid any fines. If you cannot return it by the due date, we encourage students to renew their books online. If you happen to obtain a fine, you can pay with cash at the circulation desk or you can add the fine to your school bill. Ask to fill out a pink slip.

WRITING CENTRE

The Library houses the Burman University Writing Centre which offers writing support services in all subject areas. Our goal is to help students become more confident, self-directed and informed writers so that they can achieve greater academic and professional success. The Writing Centre offers one-on-one tutoring, workshops, and a variety of helpful support materials.
